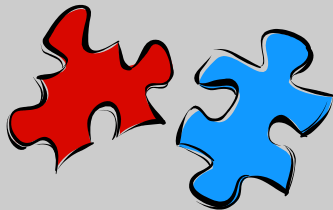

Information for Mentors

Research shows that children who are involved in a mentorship program:

- Are 46 % less likely to initiate drug use
- Are 26 % less likely to initiate alcohol use
- Are 33% less likely to be violent
- Have better relationships with friends & family
- Skip school less often
- Show an increase in GPA
- Are more likely to graduate



What is the role of a Mentor?

The primary role of a mentor is to be a trusted adult friend to a student. This means that mentors engage in fun and uplifting activities with students. The mentor listens and responds with care, compassion and sincere interest. A mentor is committed to the time set aside to be with a student. The mentor does not try to 'fix' the challenging aspects of a student's life, rather, is there to be a needed reminder that the student is interesting, fun, valued and worthy of a trusting relationship.

The mentor's role is unique from most other relationships in a student's life.
